




Alison Price to theming the celebrations around Shakespeare's A Midsummer Night's Dream, this London couple's wedding day was a fashionable affair accented with Oriental blooms and vibrant colours. 'I really wanted to create a dramatic effect using bright colours such as mango, fuchsia and lime, coupled with the romance of lavish floral decorations,' remembers Joanna.

As the awesome sound of the Brompton Oratory Choir resounded throughout the chapel, the bride walked down the petalstrewn aisle on the arm of her proud father. Her glamorous dress, a full-skirted, strapless design in duchesse silk, had been inspired by Grace Kelly's classic 1950s style. The bridesmaids also looked gorgeous in floor-length pale mango gowns with pink silk flowers pinned in their hair, while the younger flowergirls' fairy-like floral dresses captured the ethereal theme perfectly. After the moving ceremony, everyone made their way to the reception venue, The Polish Hearth Club. 'We've held many family celebrations there, including my







parents' 30th wedding anniversary, so it seemed the perfect choice for another very special occasion,' explains Joanna. With pink champagne and Bellini cocktails flowing as if on tap, the party soon got in full swing. The dramatic colour scheme extended to the reception tables, which were draped in lime green tablecloths and decorated with tablecentres of vividlycoloured orchids and roses, encircled with spiralling bamboo shoots. A delicious wedding feast was followed by speeches, the most memorable from Joanna's father, which featured anecdotes in poem form about family and friends at the mention of each name the guests responded with cheers and applause! As darkness fell, the mood hotted up and a 1970s band took to the stage, kicking off a party that lasted well into the night. Revellers kept their energy up with an early breakfast of mini BLT sandwiches, waffles with maple syrup and salmon and cream cheese bagels; it wasn't until the small hours that the newlyweds reluctantly made their exit to spend their first night at the central London hotel, The Capital. 

FIRST ENCOUNTER: "We met at a party in June 1995 when I was 25 and Jon was 26," says Gabriella. "He invited me to the Epsom Derby the following day. As we left, he bought a bunch of red roses for me. We then dated for six months before we even had our first kiss!"

PROPOSAL: Jon proposed to Gabriella in October 2001, when they were on holiday in Catalonia,

Spain. "We were having dinner at a small restaurant when he simply asked, 'How do you feel about a wedding next summer?' It took me a while to figure out that it was our wedding he was referring to! Jon gave me my ring when we returned to England and we celebrated the engagement properly."

PLANAING THE WEDDING: The couple tied the knot in Marylebone register office in London a month before their ceremony in Tuscany, Italy. Gabriella started planning

shortly after her engagement and was assisted by her family, friends and wedding coordinator Katja Meier. "My parents bought coloured ribbons and linen which my mother dyed different colours and turned into tablecloths and napkins for the reception," says Gabriella. "The name cards were made from aqua and green recycled card and the menus were printed on pink recycled paper." WILDING PARE: 13 July 2002.

with 160 guests, underneath beautifully decorated olive trees on the terrace of Gabriella's parents' house near Sovicille. "I used books on alternative marriages to find our vows and blessings and we used the poems My Lover by Wendy Cope and Love - An Essay by Laurie Lee as readings. Our friends began the proceedings by lighting lanterns and then covering the bridal path with rosemary and thyme. Afterwards we all had a wonderful reception dinner in an adjacent field." THE DRESS: "I wore a mock silksatin and champagne coloured 1930s vintage wedding dress from Orsini Period Clothing, and had it

altered by a wonderful dressmaker called Jackie Palmer," says Gabriella. "It made me feel really glamorous." GROOM'S OUTHIT: Jon wore a grey pinstriped suit and pink tie, all from Richard James in Savile Row, London. ACCESSORIES: Gabriella wore a gold and silver feather and flower headdress with Swarovski crystals by Philip Treacy. Her pearl, garnet

and citrine engagement ring and pearl and gold drop earrings were from The L Boutique and her strappy gold wedge shoes were from L K Bennett.

MAKE-UP AND HAIR: Gabriella styled her own hair and went for make-up lessons at Trish McEvoy in Harvey Nichols to pick up some tips to do her own make-up. She used pink and beige shades.

BRIDESMADS: Gabriella's sister Louise was her bridesmaid and wore a pale pink dress and crystal necklace from Baby Ceylon. Her D









Isuede camel slingbacks were from L K Bennett, and she wore a flower headpiece by Jackie Palmer. FLOWERS: Tamara Pasquinucci from Artflor in Tuscany arranged all the flowers. Tables were decorated with Italian garden flowers and put in different shaped vases from the Designers Guild. Gabriella's bouquet was of cream peonies.

Foon: Guests were served a variety of canapés at the reception and then started with steamed scampi and prawns, followed by duck breast with fragrant spices and fine green beans. Dessert was a rainbow of

fruit salad and all the food was made by Gamma Italia Ricevimenti. THE CAKE: The couple had a cream and strawberry and meringue cake.

MOST MENORABLE MOMENT: "It was when Jon and I walked hand in hand down to the candlelit dining tents through a fairy-lit arch," says Gabriella. "The scene was more stunning than I had ever anticipated." HONEYMOON: The couple booked their honeymoon in Bolivia through Magic of Bolivia and had a simply wonderful time.
